Dinner with Rick Stewart – September 26, 2011

A native of Roseburg, Oregon, *Rick Stewart* has spent most of his life, in one capacity or another, in the great outdoors. He was awarded several decorations as a firefighter and paramedic during his first four years of military service.

These include a Commendation Medal for saving the life of a young woman involved in an automobile accident in 1979, and a medal for heroism during a B-52 aircraft fire loaded with nuclear weapons in 1980.

Cross training into the SERE community in 1980, *Rick* graduated in the top of his class at the *United States Air Force Instructor Training School*. His reputation, work ethic, leadership, and technical skill presented him with many challenging, yet rewarding training opportunities for working with the most elite organizations of our military and government.

From *NASA to SEAL Teams*, the *CIA* to the *Defense Intelligence Agency*, *Rick Stewart* has provided survival training around the world. In 1984 he was honored by the military as both *Armed Forces Person of the Year and Survival (SERE) Instructor of the Year*. During *Desert Shield*, while providing chemical defense and escape and evasion training for American and coalition forces in Saudi Arabia, *Rick* received

an *Award of Recognition* from *General Philip Killian*, then Director of HQ USAFANG.

Rick Stewart has authored hundreds of documents on the subject of survival, disaster planning, and

wrote the protocol used by all USAF personnel for decontamination in a CBRNE environment. He has personally participated in research and development studies for the military related to CBRNE that put him in the proximity and direct contact with “live” weapons grade chemical agents.

As a public speaker, inventor, and entrepreneur, Rick has earned a reputation for his tireless passion, driven intensity, creative innovation, and intuitive approach to business and life in general. He is an ordained minister, Master Scuba Diver, and has even found time to coach and preside as President over Eugene Little League Baseball for three years

In 2003, Rick Stewart was honored by the United States Air Force as an Honorary Chief Master Sergeant, and award that has been given only 4 times in the history of the Air Force Life Support Community.

Today Rick is the Host and Executive Producer of *NRA's Line of Duty Television* and the *Senior Military Advisor* for American Warrior Magazine. He is the *CEO of R.W. Stewart Incorporated*, an Independent Contracting Company and the *President of American Zealot (Zealot LLC)* a business that provides training and equipment to military and government entities.

We have six valued trustees and their duties are:

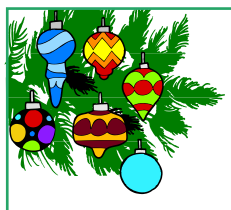
- To attend board meetings,
- Trustees are encouraged to volunteer as a standing committee chair, i.e., Christmas party chair, Program chair, Caring for America chair etc.
- To perform the duty or Auditor of the Treasurer's books
- and to form a committee of three to prepare an audit report for presenting in January to a regular meeting.

Because our lives have become so complicated and our focus for 2012 should be electing national, state, and local republicans, I am recommending some changes for the 2012 board.

Our By-Laws state that we have eight meetings a year but they do not have to be formal meetings at Valley River Inn. I propose we contract for 3 to 4 large meetings and the rest can be informal meetings at LCR office to help candidates during the election or deciding to have a candidate picnic or whatever is appropriate. It will be up to the new President and the board to decide these matters. This simple change will mean less responsibility for the board and more focus on candidates.

Another possibility would be a co-Presidency where responsibilities are split. This would serve two goals: give each person real help and train the next president. The practice could continue, if successful or just dropped after 2012 election year.
